Imperial Proclamation Concerning the Title "Regent"

From this day forth, the title of Regent will be officially used ONLY when the Reigning Monarch is appointed as opposed to being elected by the people and ONLY during the time of this appointed reign.

After the year has been completed successfully, they will have earned the title of "Emperor" or "Empress". Having fulfilled their obligation, they should be awarded their number or symbol, whichever is appropriate for their Kingdom, and will no longer be identified as "Regent" in either their title or official protocol.

Historically, a **regent** (from the Latin *regens* "who reigns") is a person selected to act as Head of State (ruling or not) because the ruler/monarch is a minor, not present or debilitated. In a monarchy, a regent usually governs due to one of these reasons, but may also be appointed to rule during the interim when the royal line has died out ... or no one wants the position Upon termination of their tenure, they no longer carried the title of "regent"
